On Fridays learners either attend a vocational provider, work experience placement, onsite enrichment/catch up sessions or work online to complete additional independent study.

Additionally learners may be set tasks to complete for enrichment – visiting colleges, museums, libraries, going shopping, doing sport etc to develop their independence and resilience. These activities are personalised to meet the needs of each learner.

Blended Learners

Some learners require a more flexible and personalised provision. This may be because they are high risk individuals or they require a nurturing curriculum that focuses on life skills. These learners access much smaller groups, where they have 1:1 support. Direct teaching is supported by online literacy and numeracy sessions.

Medical Needs Online

Inpatients at Wigan REAI are able to access out online learning resources supported by ward staff. This is done depending on the “wellness” of the individual learner and is determined by ward staff.

All medical needs learners have access to 25 hours provision but the actual hours of learning is always determined by the health of the learner and may vary from week to week depending on medical advice.

Medical Needs Outreach

Some medical needs referrals are for short term support whilst the learner either recovers from hospital treatment or whilst learners are reintegrated back into school following periods of absence due to mental health issues. These learners receive up to six weeks support. This is usually a combination of direct teaching to help the learner complete work from their mainstream school and access to online lessons. The timetable is negotiated with each individual school, who also provide the work to be completed.
