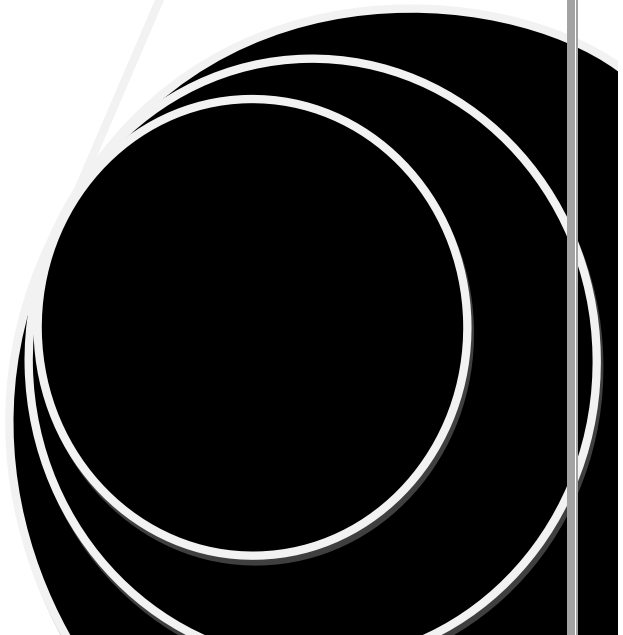

3008-01 level 1 NVQ certificate in Hairdressing and Barbering	Recognises the skills required to work as an assistant in a salon includes 6 units to achieve full qualification
3002-20 level2 diploma in hairdressing services	Learners just starting out in hairdressing. They will complete 9 core units and 2 optional units
3002-41 certificate in hairdressing reception	Normally completed alongside 3002-20 to gain more credits. Learners will gain all knowledge needed to work on reception in a salon.
6911-02 level 2 Award in contact Dermatitis	Covers a range of areas and will increase awareness of work related contact dermatitis within industries where it is a high occupational risk. 2 day course.

All courses can be tailor made to suit your school. Now offering 1 or 2 year courses.

Fees:

Schools will be expected to pay examination fees for their own learners and Tyler Lee Hair Company will invoice the schools if the examinations are arranged through them.

Schools will be expected to pay registration fees, log book charges and course fees.

We offer discounted course fees for schools that send 8 learners.

The school will be invoiced for the above in year 10. Certificates will issued at the end of each course and cost between £21.00 - £30.00	
Note: These charges can change due to City and Guilds amendments.	

When asking for places on the courses, schools need to recognise that they are making a one or two year commitment to cover these costs for all learners and they will be invoiced on that basis even if learners change their minds or leave the course. The same cost will operate for two years. Invoicing will take account of schools financial years.

Tyler Lee Hair Company will invoice three times a year during a two year programme as follows:

- First invoice December
- Second invoice April
- Third invoice June

The cost listed in entries is for one academic year.

Learning support:

Learners in mainstream schools who would have learning support at school are entitled to learning support while they are with Tyler Lee Hair Company. It is the responsibility of the school to ensure this happens. If the pupil has individual support, the support member of staff would be expected to accompany them to the Tyler Lee Hair Company.

Service level agreements:

Tyler Lee Hair Company is expected to develop a service level agreement that outlines processes and procedures to ensure the quality of provision and identify areas of responsibility. This will include attendance reporting and monitoring progression. This will be developed once the school has chosen Tyler Lee.

Attendance:

There is a minimum expectation of 92% attendance of all applicants on all partnership courses, unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Application time table:

February 2016 open evening. Inviting all vocational/careers officers to open day giving them a chance to see what we offer.

March 2016 learners will be decided on the course they wish to go on. I would like to ask schools to view our prospectus in this process.

April 2016 schools will let us know if they wish to use our provision.

June/July 2016 Induction days/ interviews for candidates.
